This conference is aimed at all professionals working with Young People within the Criminal Justice and Mental Health systems. We will explore the role that mental health services have within the criminal justice setting and the key issues about addressing the mental health needs of this vulnerable population. Eminent speakers from voluntary and statutory agencies will explore causes of crime in young people, review the cutting edge of evidence-based treatments and present creative ways of developing inter agency working.

There will be an emphasis on building practical clinical skills in managing complex clinical presentations, risk management, and development of best practice. Dr Elspeth McAdam will conclude the day by discussing innovative ways to instill hope, empower, and engage the young people to move beyond a life of crime.

The overall aim of the day is to enhance knowledge and skills of the professionals and policy makers involved in order to ensure the young people's mental health can be appropriately assessed and managed.

AIMS OF THE CONFERENCE

The conference aims to broaden each delegate's knowledge and enhance practical workplace skills to ensure the young people's mental health can be appropriately assessed and managed.

The event will provide a forum for the delegates to engage in open debate about the controversies regarding the role of mental health services in young people engaged in crime through panel discussions. It is hoped that delegates will have a chance to challenge their own beliefs and hear a variety of views from the conference speakers and other delegates.
