**C**ygnet Hospital Hexham is our new 27 bed mental health facility for women with complex mental health needs which is due to open in Autumn 2020. The hospital will be built to meet the latest national specifications for improving mental health within a therapeutic environment.

Situated amongst the soft fields and meadows of the Tyne valley, which is known for its abbey, leafy parks, and mix of independent shops, the hospital will provide an important and much-needed service for service users within the North East of England.

As part of our continued efforts to improve service users care and treatment pathway's the hospital will benefit from a highly experienced team of mental health professionals and support staff, which include consultant psychiatrists, psychologists, nurses across RMN/RGN/RNLD disciplines, occupational therapists, speech and language therapists, and support workers.

Positive service user outcomes are at heart of the services we offer at Cygnets Hospital Hexham, we recognise that every service user is different and therefore must be assessed and treated as an individual in the best possible surroundings.

The hospital will be split into two distinct wards, each offering specialist mental health services:



**Fisher Ward** is our new mental health acute service for women with complex mental health needs. The service at Fisher Ward provides a comprehensive range of treatment for women aged between 18 and above, who require treatment in an inpatient setting. We are also able to meet the needs of service users with a co-morbid diagnosis of learning disability.

The service and care delivery model is underpinned by an established CBT framework 'Comprehend Cope and Connect', a transdiagnostic approach to mental health difficulties that brings together the impact of past trauma and adversity on present coping (comprehend), and utilises mindfulness and compassion-focussed approaches to manage change (cope and connect).

The ethos of this service is to assess and treat service users in a minimally restrictive environment and to plan for discharge in a robust and timely fashion.

Our experienced multi-disciplinary team works collaboratively with service users, carers, commissioners and the home team to provide a safe, effective and responsive treatment pathway that is co-produced and recovery orientated.

The care pathway of 28 days aims to ensure a short length of stay and safe return to the community, where possible.

### Our service user profile:

- > Women, aged 18+
- > May be informal or detained under the Mental Health Act
- > Experiencing an acute episode of mental illness that cannot be safely managed in the community
- > Co-morbid diagnosis of mild learning disability and autism
- > Diagnoses may also include:
  - Depression, Bi-polar illness and other mood disorders
  - Anxiety
  - Psychosis
  - Schizophrenia
  - Schizo-Affective Disorder
  - Personality disorders
  - Dual diagnosis
  - Substance misuse issues

**Franklin Ward** is our new 10 bed female PICU service which will accept emergency and crisis admissions. Referrals will come to us from all areas, including acute and prison services. Our aim is a short, rapid intervention to help service users regain a sense of control and order in their lives, so they can move to a less restrictive care setting and ultimately return home.

The service provides expert, intensive, short-term, individualised care for service users detained under the Mental Health Act. Service users will present with increased risks that require them to be assessed and treated in a PICU environment.

### Our service user profile:

- > Women, aged 18+
- > Detained under the Mental Health Act
- > Experiencing difficulties that present a risk to the well-being of themselves or others that cannot be treated in an open environment
- > Diagnoses may also include:
  - Acute mental illness
  - Acute depressive illness
  - Psychosis
  - Schizophrenia
  - Bi-polar disorder
  - Personality disorder
  - Dual diagnosis
- > May present with co-morbid presentations:
  - Self-harm
  - Substance misuse issues
  - Complex needs
